A Fife amateur football club is looking to continue its league matches in style with sponsorship from Fife Ethylene Plant.

The Swifts FC – which has more than 500 players from 4 years up to seniors, including women's and walking football teams – from all over Fife, has hit the back of the net with a grant of £5000
